




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'Kilikalum cool avatte' Summer Campaign Inauguration




Figure 4Ali Keeriyadan poring water in hanging pots for birds as a part of 'Kilikalum cool avatte' campaign.

Various online programmes, BMC members participated during the year


Bhoomitrasena Club of Rouzathul Uloom Arabic College Member actively participated in different online programmes like webinars and quiz competition during the academic year.
