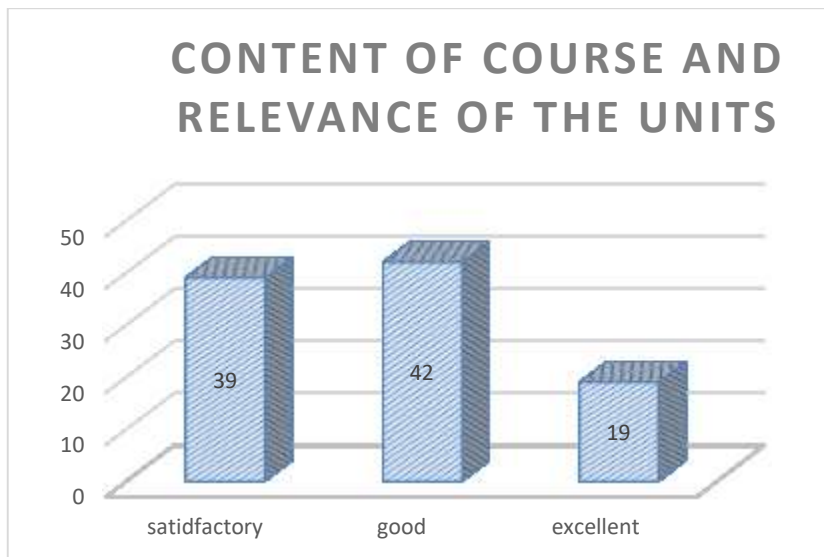

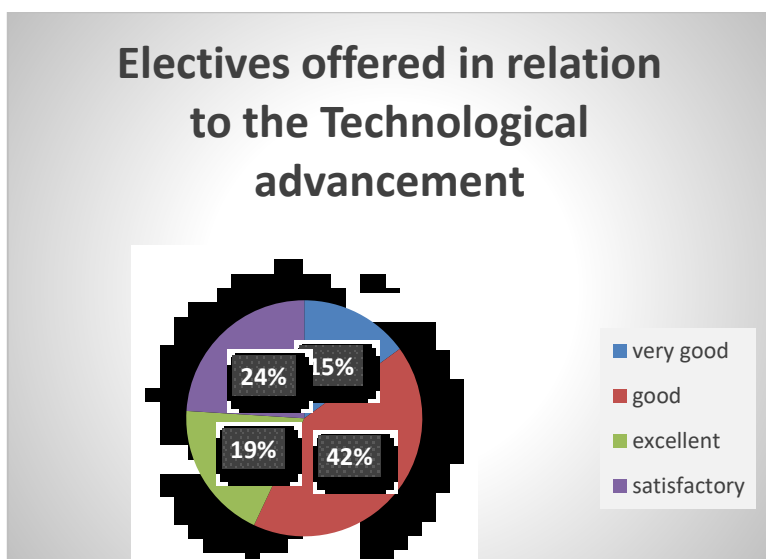

Content of Course and Relevance of the Units



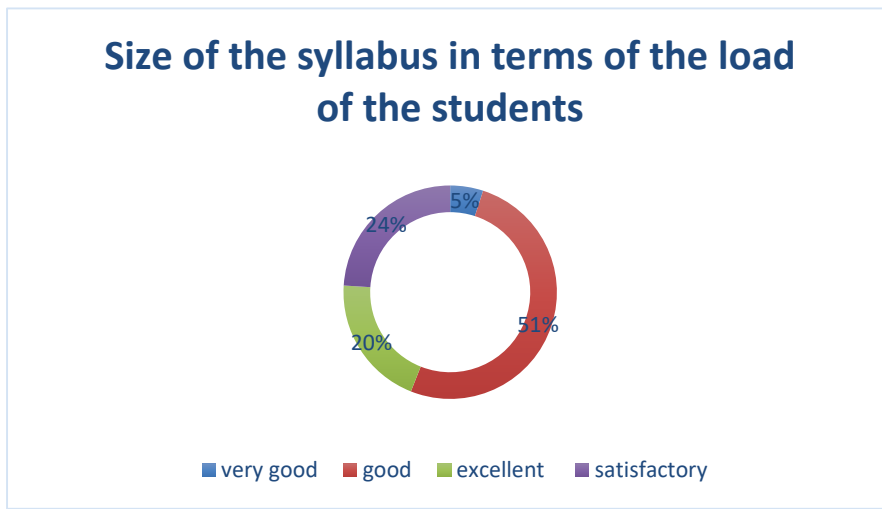

Size of the Syllabus in terms of the Load of the Students



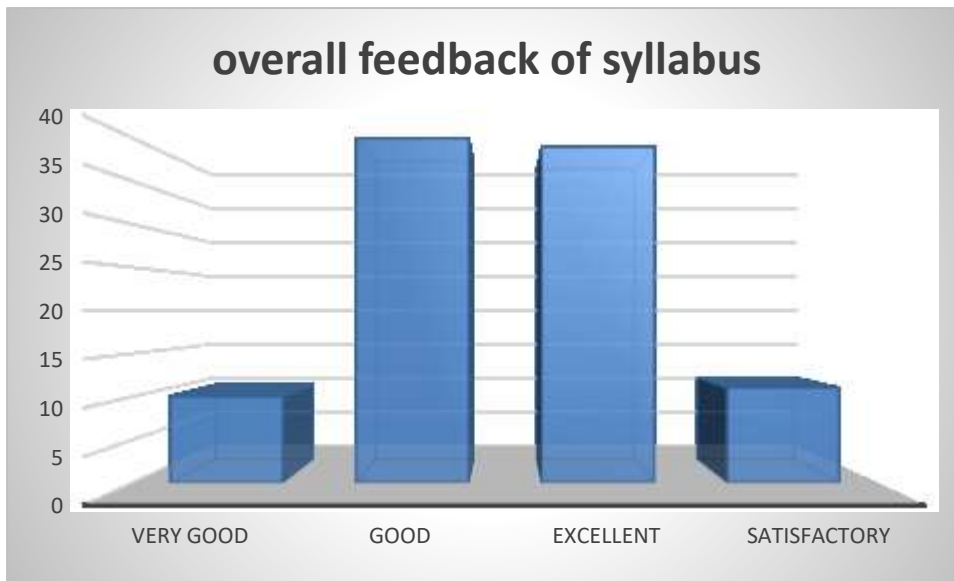

Usefulness of the Course in terms of Knowledge, Concepts, Vocational Skills And Analytical Abilities



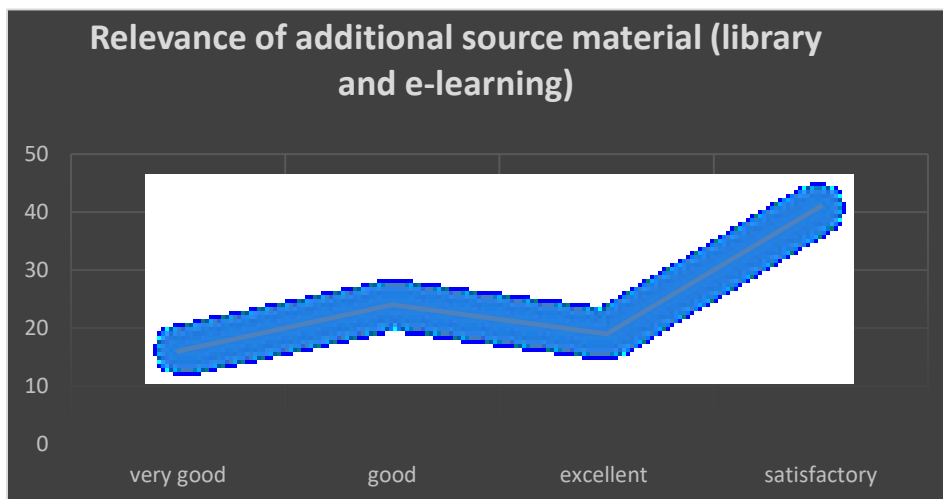

Overall Feedback Of Syllabus



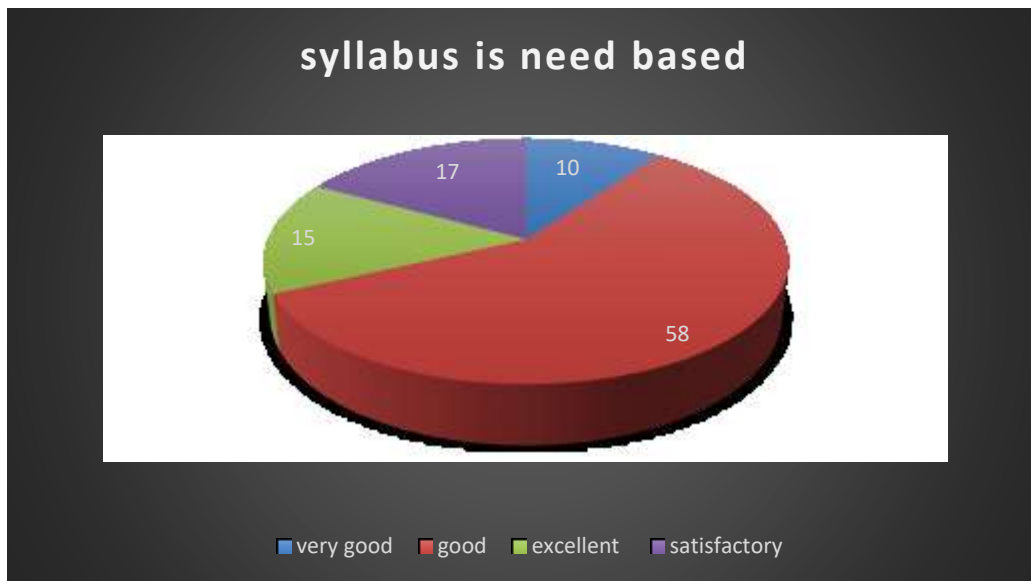
40% of students agreed that the syllabus is good and 39% agreed it is excellent.
