


STUDENTS FEEDBACK


Gender wise classification of students

Is syllabus is creating interest on you



Did syllabus fulfill the expectations?



Syllabus is need based



Does syllabus integrate with environmental and gender issues



Effectiveness of classroom experience in acquiring the syllabus



Content and overall objectives of syllabi



Internal examination helps the effective evaluation and content delivery



Role of syllabus in innovative thinking of students



INTERPRETATION

- ➤ Total 225 responses have been collected from the student, out of which 68% were female and 32% were male.

- > 78% of students agreed that syllabus fulfill the expectations and remaining 22% are not fulfill the expectations.
- ➤ More than 30% students opined that syllabus is need based and only 1% of respondent are strongly disagree.
- ➤ 58% students agreed that their syllabus integrate environmental and gender issues and 42%do not agree with this.
- ➤ Majority of students (66%) agreed that classroom experience is effective in acquiring the syllabus.

- > 41% of students agreed with the content and overall objectives of the syllabi.
- > 85% of the students agreed that the internal examination helps the effective evaluation and content delivery.
- ➤ 62% of students agreed that the syllabus played a great role in innovative thinking of students.
