

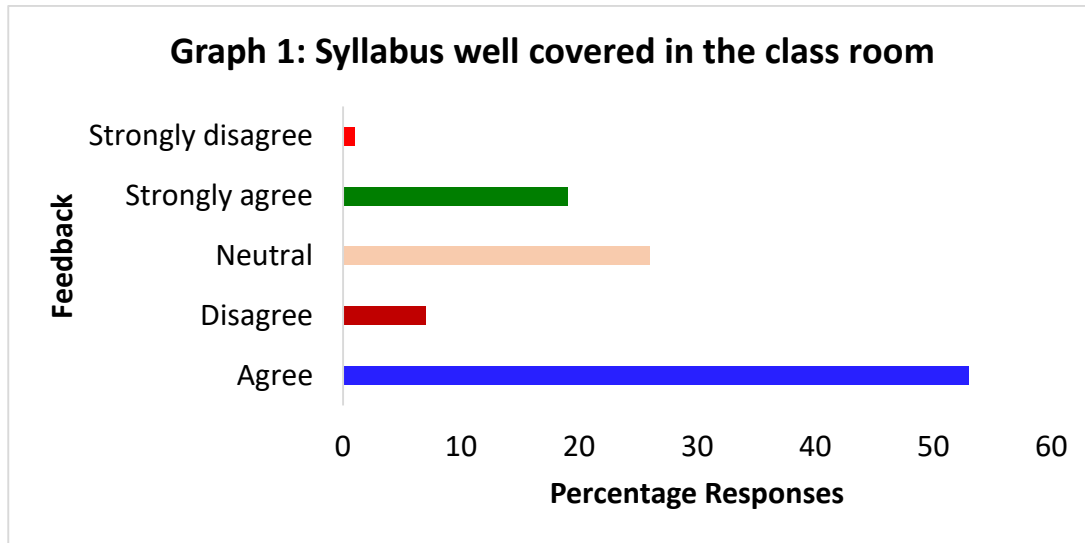

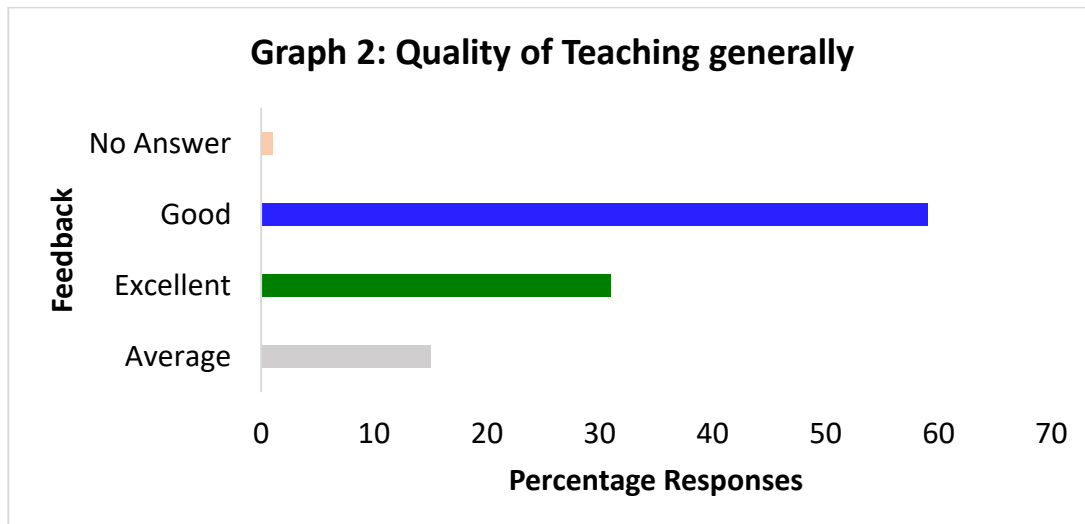
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Student's response to Syllabus Completion



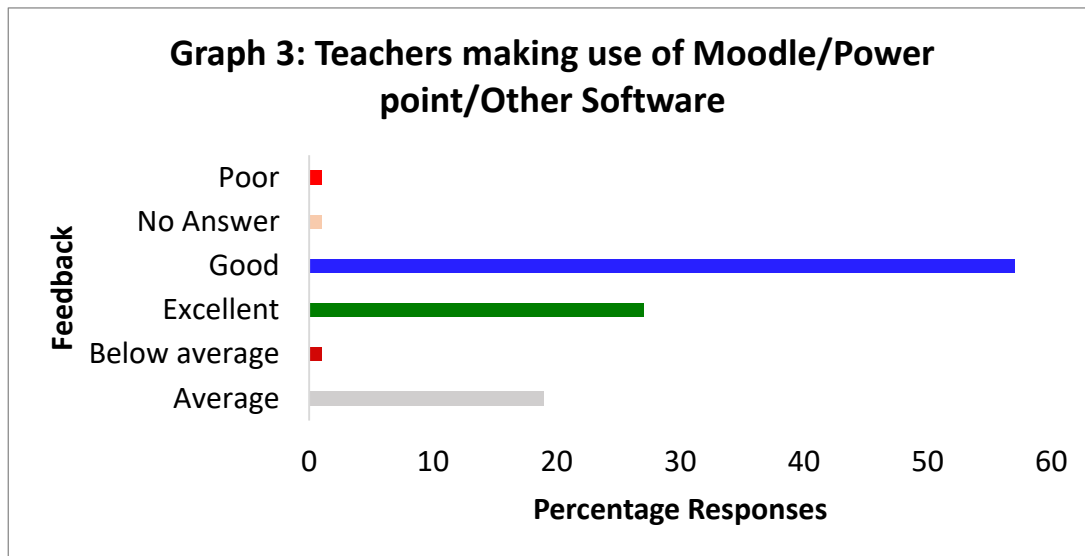

This suggests a significant majority of students are satisfied with classroom syllabus coverage, while a smaller portion express dissatisfaction. Approximately 25% remain neutral. Overall, the findings indicate a generally positive sentiment regarding syllabus coverage, though efforts to address concerns of the dissatisfied minority and engage neutral students may enhance overall satisfaction and effectiveness of teaching methods.

Student's response to quality of teaching



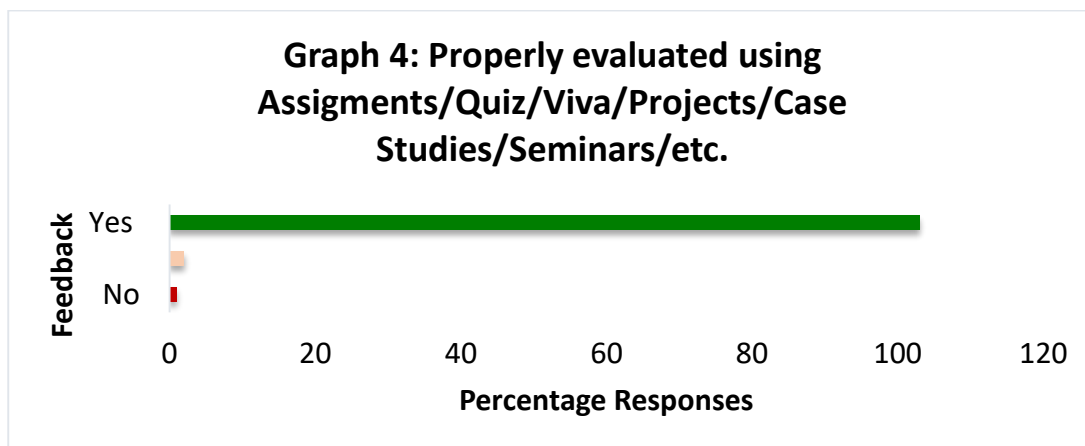

Students response to usage of ICT



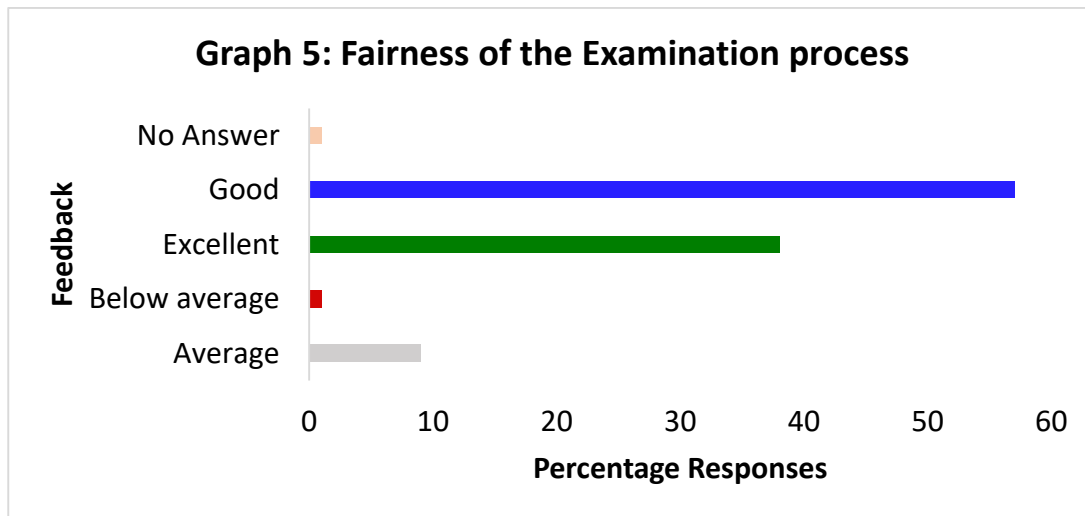

Overall, the majority of students acknowledge effective use of digital tools by teachers, indicating potential benefits in enhancing learning experiences. However, addressing concerns of the average ratings could optimize the integration of technology in teaching methodologies.

Evaluation by teachers



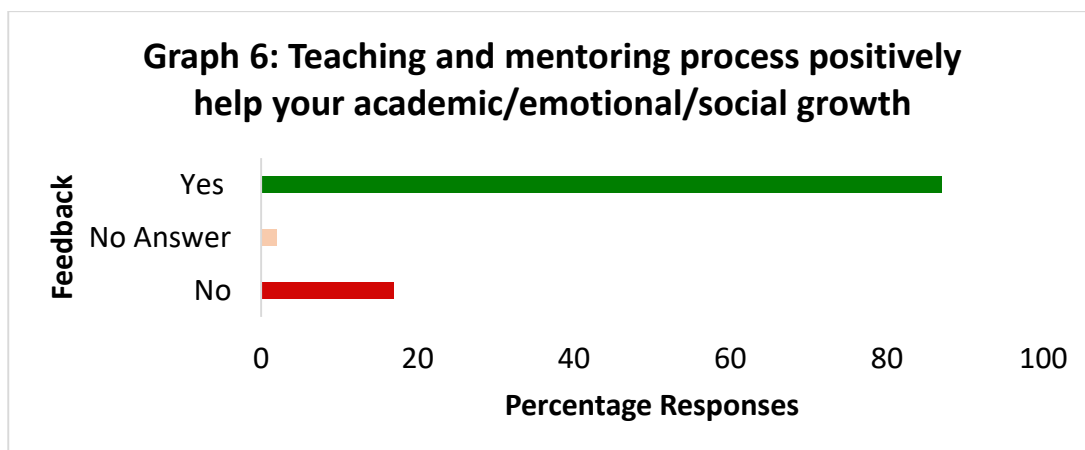
According to the Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS), 97% of students feel properly evaluated using various methods such as assignments, quizzes, viva, projects, case studies, and seminars. Only 1% of students reported feeling improperly evaluated, and 2 responses were missing. This overwhelmingly positive response suggests that students perceive the evaluation methods as effective and comprehensive in assessing their understanding and skills across different aspects of their coursework. However, addressing the concerns of the minority who disagreed and ensuring all students participate in feedback processes could further enhance the effectiveness and fairness of evaluation methods.

Fairness in exam process



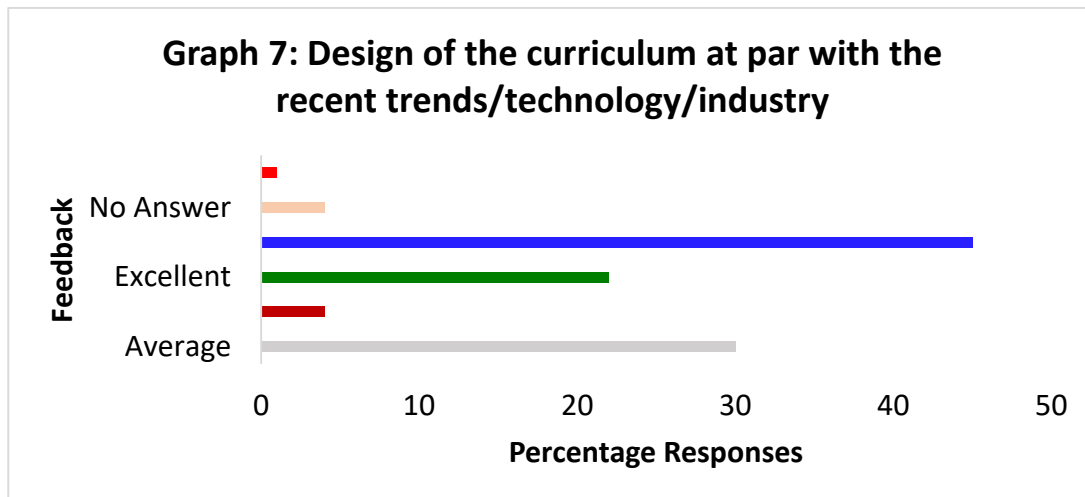

However, 9% rated it as average and 1% as below average. One response was missing. Teaching and mentoring process



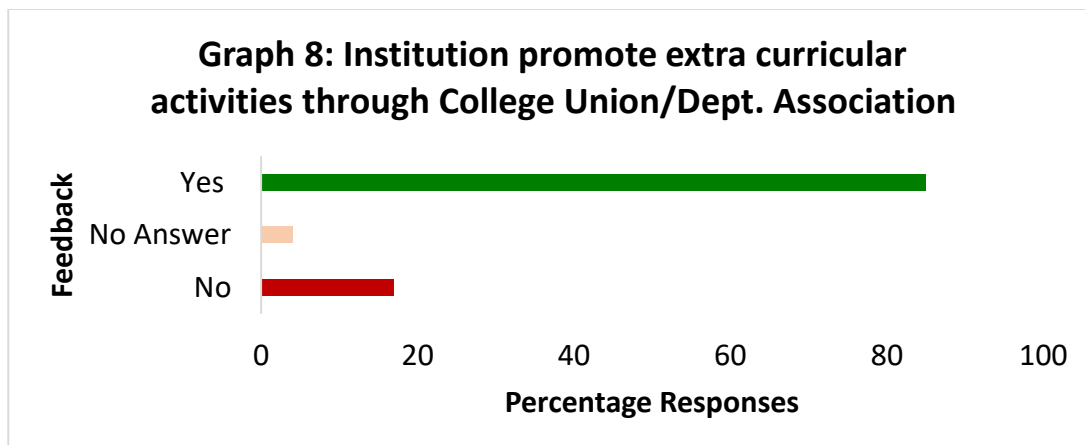

Curriculum design



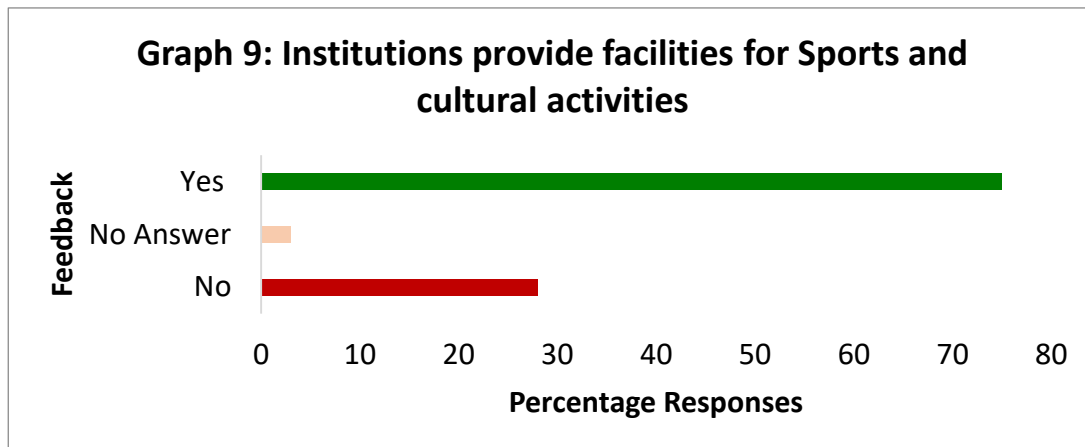

While 45% rate it as good and 22% as excellent, a notable 30% find it average, with smaller proportions rating it below average (4%) or poor (1%). Four responses were missing. This suggests a mixed perception among students, with a significant portion seeing room for improvement in incorporating contemporary trends and industry relevance into the curriculum. Addressing concerns raised by those who rated it average or below could enhance alignment with evolving industry needs and technology, improving overall satisfaction.

Promotion of extracurricular activities



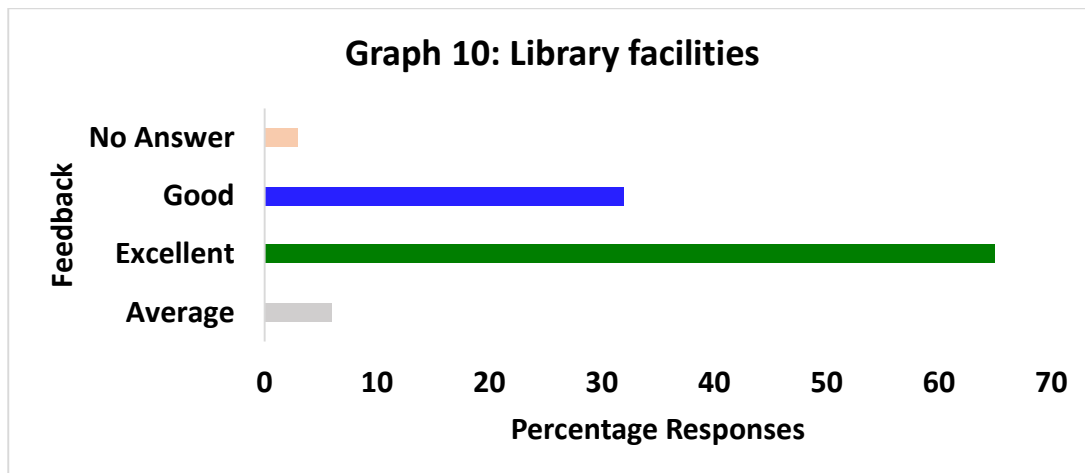

However, addressing concerns raised by the minority who disagreed and ensuring all students have ample opportunities to participate in extracurricular activities could further enhance student satisfaction and overall campus experience.

Facilities for sports and cultural activities



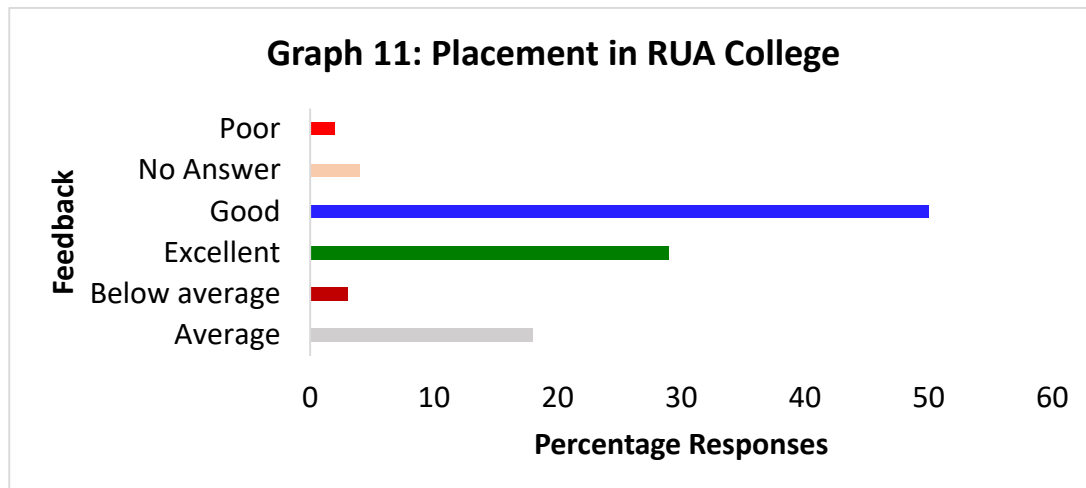

Library facilities



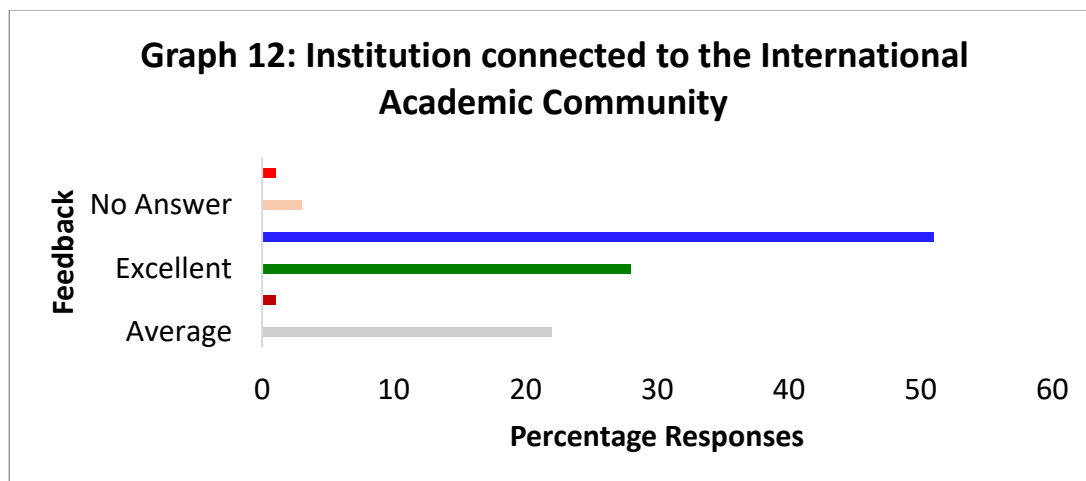

Placement



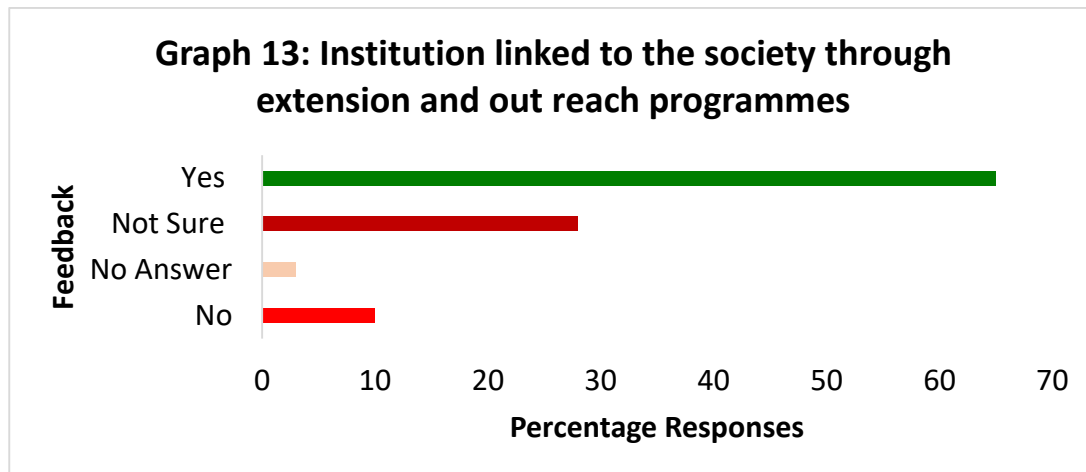

Connection of the institution



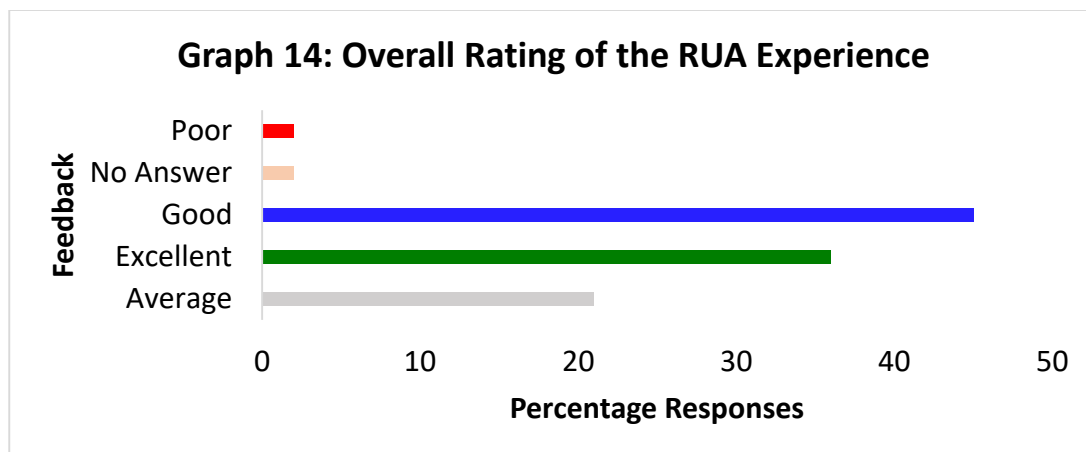

Addressing uncertainty among students and strengthening outreach initiatives could enhance community involvement and foster positive societal impact, aligning with the institution's mission of social responsibility.
